Who was Shah Nematollah Vali?

One of the great masters of Sufism in the 14th and 15th century. Born in Aleppo (Syria) in 1329 and buried in Mahan (Iran) in 1431.

After his study of the important books in his time he traveled around the world. And he visited many Sufi masters until he met the Grand Master Sheikh Abdollah Yafei in a mosque in Mecca. He practiced the spiritual exercises for seven years under the guidance of this master. Thereafter he traveled to Egypt, Iran, Tukistan and Samarkant for retreats and spiritual quarantines. At last he spent 25 years in Mahan, where he died when he was approximately 104 years old. His shrine is in Mahan in the province of Kerman, Iran.

Shah Nematollah wrote at least 300 books and over 14.000 mystic poems are assigned to him. Many scholars around the world are still studying the manuscripts. The highly evolved spiritual state he reached expresses itself in these works.

He was the founder of the Nematollahi order, one of the largest Sufi Orders in the world.

“The Sufi Masters of this order traveled in the world for inviting all people to Unity, Peace and Tolerance. They taught the way of spirituality to the human being. The Sheikhs and the Masters of this order consider every one to have the capacity to be the vicar of God on earth. The differences of the skin’s color, geographical origin, culture, language, etc., are not the important factors for the substantial evolution.”¹

Why this symposium?

The main objectives of this Symposium is to bring together the scientific research on the works of Shah Nematollah Vali and other Sufi masters and its application to today’s global cultural environment.
